District # 7 Governor**

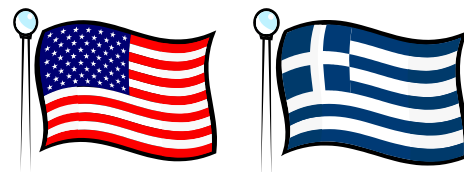


Hello Brothers,

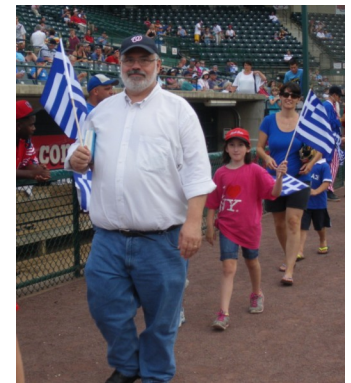
