Greetings to all in the Ahepa Family, We have just returned from the Supreme Convention in Orlando, Florida. The week was exciting and





HOUSTON NATIVE RUNS UNCONTESTED ORLANDO - The delegates of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), a leading association for the nation's millions of American citizens of Greek heritage and Philhellenes, elected Anthony Kouzounis, Houston, as their supreme president at the 91st Annual Supreme Convention, Orlando, Fla. Kouzounis ran unopposed in elections that were held Friday, August 23, 2013. Formal installation ceremonies were held Saturday, August 24, 2013.

Yankee District #7 and Capitol Hill Day (May 22, 2013) By Nicholas Nikas



You probably saw the May 28 press release and AHEPA News emails from AHEPA HQ featuring many photographs of our Supreme President, Dr. John Grossomanides, with US Congressmen, Senators, and other dignitaries and famous AHEPAns, taken on Capitol Hill Day, May 22, 2013. That evening, the Congressional Banquet at the famous Willard Hotel offered even more photo opportunities. The headline read: "Greek Americans Bring Foreign, Domestic Issues to Legislators' Attention; More than 70 Congressional Offices Visited during Capitol Hill Day; Congressional Banquet Triumphantly Returns to Nation's Capital". It was a glorious day, another outstanding event during Brother John's term.

The purpose of this short article is to point out something that went unrecognized that day. Yankee District participation was small in numbers but strong in impact. Among the 70 or so people who went to Capitol Hill, there were only 3 representing our district: Greg Stamos from New Haven, John Grossomanides from Norwich, and yours truly from Stamford. The purpose of our visit to Capitol Hill was to educate our US Representatives on the issues our Hellenic community cares about, and to convince them to join the Congressional Caucus on Hellenic Issues (affectionately known as the Hellenic Caucus). Armed with appointment times and locations and professional briefing packages provided by Andrew Kaffes, Greg and I, along with Costa Papademetriou, who lives in Stamford but belongs to the chapter of New Rochelle, NY, visited the offices of our US Representatives Rosa DeLauro (CT-3) and Jim Himes (CT-4), and our Senator Chris Murphy. Congratulations Yankee District #7! Just remember that we cannot rest on our laurels. The hard work of continuing to educate our Representatives on Hellenic issues and encouraging them to improve their score on our Congressional Scorecard lies ahead.

Honoring our Father/Son AHEPAn Pairs – Passing the Torch Fundraiser for Humanitarian Greek Relief and Stamford Greek Schools



We will also publish a commemorative ad album.


