#### Phillip T. Frangos Elected Supreme President Michigan Native Runs Uncontested



**NEW ORLEANS, LA -** The delegates of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), a leading association for the nation's millions of American citizens of Greek heritage and hellenes, elected Phillip T. Frangos, East Lansing, Mich., as their supreme president at the 92nd Annual Supreme Convention, New Orleans, La. Frangos ran unopposed in elections that were held Friday, July 25, 2014. Formal installation ceremonies were held Saturday, July 26, 2014. "It is an honor and privilege to be elected AHEPA supreme president," Supreme President Frangos said. "It is with



humility that I undertake the responsibilities of this office. I thank those who have mentored me, supported me, inspired me, and tutored me over the many years that I have been a member of an organization which carries the torch of Hellenism.

He added, "The community continues to

face a multitude of challenges that are important to address as the need for community service is relentless, both in the United States and abroad, and the promotion of Hellenic ideals will always be a priority for AHEPA. I am excited to work with our seasoned Supreme Lodge and our membership to address these challenges and keep AHEPA on the steady path set forth by my predecessors in a spirit true to our mission." Frangos is a member of Wolverine Chapter 142, Lansing, Mich. He has served AHEPA in numerous leadership positions including most recently supreme vice president and all offices at the district and chapter levels. He also served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees in the mid-1980s. As supreme president, Frangos's responsibilities include being the chief executive officer, and principal spokesperson, of the entire AHEPA domain, which includes the United States, Canada, and chapters in Europe.

gion IV: Frank P. Fotis, Region V: Costas Boutsikakis, Region VI: Nick Kavadas, Region VII: Timothy Joannides, and Region VIII: Robert Sexton.

Elected to positions on the Board of Trustees were: Nicholas Karacostas and Vassos Chrysanthou. Karacostas, who is a past supreme president, was reelected to his second term on the board.

#### **AHEPA Family Elections**

The organizations that comprise the AHEPA Family also held elections. Anna-Helene Grossomanides was elected Daughters of Penelope Grand President; Jimmy Googas, was elected Sons of Pericles Supreme President; and Deanna Socaris was elected Maids of Athena Grand President.

#### **New Haven Chapter #98**

Yankee District #7 and New Haven Chapter #98 recently sponsored a scholarly Symposium at Yale University entitled "The Christian Population in the Middle East since the Arab Spring". The genesis of this was a desire by District #7 Governor Jack Isaac to extend his District mission of "giving back to the community" to include educating the general community of all of the difficulties many of our Christian brethren face throughout the world. District Governor Isaac and Chapter #98 members, National Supreme Counselor Gregory J. Stamos, and George Symiris, head of the Yale Hellenic Studies Program at Yale University, organized an esteemed panel of political scientists and historians, experts on the Middle East, who spoke on how the Arab uprising since 2011 has affected, politically and religiously, the dwindling Christian populations throughout the Middle East. In particular, emphasis was on the turmoil in both Egypt and Syria, and the dramatic changes occurring in Turkey as it relates to the Ecumenical Patriarchate and the Christian populations. The event was expertly moderated by Professor Symiris, and included Professors Steven Davis and Ellen Lust of Yale University, and Christine M. Philliou of Columbia University, a Greek-American who is an expert on the Ottoman Empire and modern day Turkey. The informative presentation, attended by nearly 100 guests, was followed by a lively and provocative question and answer period, and thereafter by a buffet meal at Luce Hall on historic Hillhouse Avenue in the heart of the Yale Campus. Chapter #98 and Yankee District #7 collaborated with the Hellenic Bar Association of Connecticut, Inc., of which Supreme Counselor Stamos is President, and with the Order of St. Andrew, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in America. The Archons were represented by Regional Commander Nik Mathews, an AHEPA member of the Stamford Chapter. The widely publicized event was also attended by District #5 Governor Sammy Thomas, District #8 Governor Frank P. Fotis, Region 4 Supreme Governor, Nicholas A. Nikas, Chapter #98 President, Eugene Esares, and the entire District #7 Lodge, as well as many other Ahepans

from throughout Connecticut.



### In Loving Memory

Brother Christos Stefanopolis, life member Newport Chapter AHEPA has passed away, he is the Father of Arthur Stefanopolis, father in law of Brother John Johnson and Brother Dr. Cosmo Haribardies.



#### "Salute" to a Veteran Alex Vlantes



Alexander Nicholas Vlantes began his long history with the AHEPA when he joined the Sons of Pericles in 1933. He was also a member of the Chapter Degree Drill Team which performed throughout the District. His father, Nicholas N. Vlantes, our dear departed Brother, was an original member of the Chapter 62 and was co-founder of the Bridgeport Church in 1913.

On September 15, 1938 at the age of 22, Alex was inducted into the AHEPA Chapter 62 and given a Certificate of Honor by the Supreme President, V. Chibithes from National Headquarters in D.C.

Alex served as District 7 Secretary from 1939 to 1945. In May 1945, he was drafted to serve in the European Theatre of Operations in World War II in the First Army. He was stationed in Aschaffenburg, Ger-

many as the Chief Clerk in the Railroad Transportation Corps. His was responsible for coordinating rail traffic throughout southern Germany which included movement of troops and supplies for the reconstruction of Europe, as well as refugee transport for their repatriation. Only in his late twenties, his letters to the family in the States were achingly homesick, especially for his newborn daughter whom he had never seen.

During his lifetime of service to AHEPA, Alex received numerous awards from the Brotherhood: a Life Membership Award from Supreme President John Plumides in August 1987, a "50 Years of Service Award" at the District & Convention in August 1989, and in 1998, he received a "60 Year Member" pin, the only Ahepan so honored in New England. Alex was a delegate to nine National Conventions, from Maine to California and maintained close relationships with scores of Brothers.

Alex served as Secretary for Chapter 62 from 1971 until his death in May 2013. During that time, he served as Finance Examiner of the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church in Bridgeport, CT for 50 continuous years!

Aleco, as he was affectionately called, was a credit to his Hellenic heritage as a son of Greek immigrants, a true patriot who left his wife and two daughters to serve his country, a devout and faithful man who worked tirelessly for his Church and community, and a dedicated, life-long member of the Brotherhood which he revered.

To honor his memory, the Brothers of Chapter 62 have begun an "Alex Vlantes Award" to the Brother who most promotes the mission of Ahepa. This year's recipient was Jim Yeotsas, a favored Brother of Alex.

The mission of the AHEPA Family is to promote Hellenism, Education, Philanthropy, Civic Responsibility, and Family and Individual Excellence.

#### Hellenism
