AHEPA's Active Role for Humanitarian Assistance in Greece

WASHINGTON, DC -- The AHEPA applauds the Obama Administration's outreach to the American Hellenic community with a discussion on Greece, August 6, 2015, at the Eisenhower **Executive Office Building,** announced Supreme President John W. Galanis.

"AHEPA sincerely appreciates the high level of engagement by US government officials to address the crisis in Greece and its outreach to Capitol Hill and the community on the crisis," Galanis said. "We found the discussion to be straightforward, insightful, and substantive. AHEPA looks forward to continued discussions and stands ready to assist with the implementation of any sustainable, concrete opportunities or solutions for Greece and its people that may materialize."

Bouzis, director, International Affairs Office of Europe & Eurasia, U.S. Dept. of the Treasury, to convey the community's appreciation for the efforts of the Treasury Secretary on Greece's debt crisis. The August 5 meeting was a followup to a letter SP John Galanis sent to Secretary Lew on the situation in Greece.

"We thank Director Bouzis for the generous amount of time she afforded us to talk about



the situation in Greece," Mossaidis said. "It was an informative meeting and we look forward to maintaining dialogue with Treasury on Greece's debt crisis." AHEPA embarked on a campaign Executive Director Basil Mossaidis met with Lea to provide humanitarian assistance to Greece since 2012:

- ◆ AHEPA collaborated with International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) to secure nine shipping containers of medical supplies which have been delivered all throughout Greece, totaling more than \$6 million in medical supply aid. Each container costs between \$15k and \$20k to secure.
- ◆ A tenth medical supply container is planned

- to be secured and sent in September.
- ♦ In 2013, AHEPA Canada donated a rigid bronchoscope machine valued at 10,000 euros (approximately \$12k Canadian) to Evangelismos Hospital. It is is used to prevent bleeding while positioning stents in tumors.
- ♦ More than \$500k was given to Apostoli Mission in Athens to feed people in Greece.
- ◆ AHEPA's 31 chapters in Greece are helping local communities through charitable and philanthropic initiatives and programs.

To date, the AHEPA family has raised nearly \$700k for humanitarian aid for the people of Greece to secure public health assistance or to help feed those in need.

Biennial Congressional Banquet was Well Attended and Well Received

WASHINGTON, DC- The American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA), held its 41st Biennial Congressional Banquet, April 29, 2015, at the Willard Intercontinental Hotel, Washington, DC. Nearly 400 leaders of the Greek American community from across the United States and Canada were on-hand to salute excellence and service in the community.

The honorees were:

- U.S. Rep. John Lewis (D-GA), 2015 AHEPA Pericles Award [presented by U.S. Rep. John Sarbanes (D-MD)];
- Ambassador Robert W. Peck, ambassador of Canada to the Hellenic Republic, 2015 AHEPA Aristotle Award (presented by AHEPA Canadian President Ken Matziorinis);
- **The Stavros Niarchos Foundation**, 2015 AHEPA Archbishop lakovos Humanitarian Award, accepted by Ambassador Vassilis Kaskarelis, senior advisor to the Board of Directors and member of the Executive Management Team of the Stavros Niarchos Foundation (presented by AHEPA National Educational Foundation Secretary George Vorkas);
- Col. Alan C. Macaulay, (USMC ret.), 2015 AHEPA Military Medal of Honor [presented by AHEPA Public Policy Chairman Carl Hollister (Maj., U.S. Army, ret)];
- Ambassador Eleni Tsakopoulos Kounalakis, 2015 Daughters of Penelope Civic Responsibility Award (presented by Daughters of Penelope Grand President Anna-Helene Grossomanides); and
- AHEPA Past Supreme President Gus J. James, II, 2015 AHEPA Lifetime Achievement Award (presented by Supreme President Phillip T. Frangos).

In acceptance remarks, the honorees shared their inspirational personal stories of triumph over adversity and reflected upon the importance of public service and community service. They also expressed gratitude toward the AHEPA and Daughters of Penelope for promoting these principles.

In his introduction of Congressman Lewis, Congressman Sarbanes described him as "A hero of our time and of all time." In addition to the Pericles Award, Congressman Lewis was presented with a custom-framed copy of the historic March 26, 1965 issue of Life Magazine "Memorial at Selma" with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and His Eminence Archbishop lakovos on the cover. The inscription written on the frame stated in part, "In Commemoration of the Unity of the African American and Greek Communities."

"When Dr. Martin Luther King issued a call, members of your church responded, and we will never forget it," Congressman Lewis said. "And fifty years later you came to Selma to walk with us. Thank you."



News from the Tri-District Convention

Another successful Tri-District Convention was held on May 29-31, 2015 in Newport, Rhode Island. The organizational skills of George and Ellen Anagnostos make for a smooth running convention and ensure a good time for everyone! Brother George Scarveles was elected chairman of the convention and handled his duties successfully. All officers of the Lodge submitted their reports on the year's activities.

Yankee News staff reported on some of the changes that would take place such as new features and chapter responsibilities. Past Supreme President John Grossomanides was acknowledged for selling nearly \$3,000 in new advertisements. The staff urged more chapters to send in information since we usually get material from five chapters each issue.

- A report was given by the new Chairman of the District Scholarship Committee, Rick Pecka. He explained some of the changes to be made. - It was suggested that money accumulated by the Yankee News be

The Publication Committee met at the Supreme Convention and has awarded the following districts in its annual competition:





We kept \$1,500 in our chapter's educational and philanthropic fund for future contributions to the Hellenic History Tournament, AHEPAcademy, and other causes.


The First-Ever Event of the AHEPA Pawtucket Chapter A121!
