Greek Islanders to be Nominated for Nobel Peace Prize

Greek islanders who have been on the frontline of the refugee crisis are to be nominated for the Nobel peace prize with the support of their national government. Of the 900,000 refugees who entered Europe last year most were received -scared, soaked and travelling in rickety boats - by those who live on the Greek islands in the Aegean Sea.

The islanders, including fishermen who gave up their work to rescue people from the sea, are in line to be honored with one of the world's most esteemed awards. Eminent academics from the universities of Oxford, Princeton, Harvard, Cornell and Copenhagen are drafting a submission in favor of awarding the prize Greek islanders pull immigrants from the sea off Rhodes to the people of Lesbos, Kos, Chíos, Samos, Rhodes and Leros.

A petition on the website of the campaign group, Avaaz, in favor of the nomination has amassed 280,000 signatures. According to the petition: "On remote Greek islands, grandmothers have sung terrified little babies to sleep, while teachers, pensioners and students have spent months offering food, shelter, clothing and comfort to refugees who have risked their lives to flee war and terror." While the official nomination letter is yet to be finalized, it is understood the academics will implore the Nobel committee members to accept their nomination. They say it must be noted that a people of a country already dealing with its own economic crisis responded to the unfolding tragedy of the refugee crisis with "empathy and self-sacrifice", opening their homes to the dispossessed, risking their lives to save others, taking care of sick and injured. In December, the image of Antonis Deligiorgis, a 34-year-old Greek army sergeant, rescuing a refugee from the turbulent waters off Rhodes was singled out as a striking illustration of the valor of those in the islands. Only individuals or organizations are eligible to win the prize so it is likely that the "solidarity networks" on the islands – groups of volunteers who organized to help the refugees – or individuals within groups will be the official nominees. A precedent was set in 1976 when Betty Williams and Mairead Corrigan won the prize

for their efforts in seeking peace in Northern Ireland. It was seen as a reward for all those who sought reconciliation during the most troubled years. The volunteer networks on the Greek islands have provided accommodation, hygiene packs, food, clothes and help with the next steps for refugees. It is claimed that the instincts of the majority of islanders set the tone across Europe towards the refugees' plight. Spyro Limneos, an activist in Greece for Avaaz who distributed aid on the islands, said: "The people involved in the solidarity networks organized and helped the desperate when the governments weren't even willing to recognize that the there was a crisis. "By opening their hearts the islanders sent a powerful message that humanity is above races, above nations. "I will never forget seeing young girls being rescued from a boat on Leros. They were smiling. They didn't have suitcases or any possessions except their end-ofyear school certificates written in Arabic. They laid those down in the sun to dry out. It was a combination of tragedy and hope."

Alexios E. Alexopoulos, 86, of Wallingford, loving husband of Angeliki Alexopoulos, passed away Thursday, November 12, 2015

Alexios was born in Strigou, Greece, July 11, 1929, a son of the late Evangelos and Eleni Alexopoulos. He was a member of St. George Greek Orthodox Church in New Britain and the Meriden Cahpter of the AHEPA. In 1978 he founded East Side Pizza Palace in Wallingford which his family still

operates.

Peter Samuel Demos, age 95 of Waterford, passed away on December 14, 2015. Peter was married to Photine M. Millaras who passed away in 2011. Peter was a graduate of Purdue University, division of Technical Institute. He joined the US Air Force in 1942 and served three and a half years during World War II participating in seven combat missions in the European Theatre and five combat air missions. He was awarded the

He worked for GE as a registered professional engineer for 40 years. He was also a member of the Board of Realtors and of the VFW. 



Salute to Veteran **Emmanuel Moshovos**

Emmanuel was born in Bloomfield, CT June 29, 1934. He attended Weaver High School and graduated in June 1952. He was the W.H.S. football captain in 1951 (7 wins-1 loss) and made All District in his Junior year and All District & All State in his Senior year. He received a full athletic scholarship to Arnold College in Milford and after his freshman year Arnold College merged with the University of Bridgeport, CT, (1952-1954) where Emmanuel "Mo" continued football and college.

He joined the U.S. Marine Platoon Leaders Corp. (PLC) for two years. He was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict era and served in an intelligence unit attached to the U.S. Airforce, McCord Airforce base, in Tacoma, Washington until his Honorable discharge in February of 1954. Prior to that Emmanuel was also known as RAMBO as illustrated in the attached picture.

He returned to College, attending the University of Hartford for two years. Following college in 1958 he



joined Sun Life of Canada for six years. Then in 1964 he was offered a District management position with the Hartford Insurance Group in Hartford, CT.

He was honored as District Governor of the year and his District was also honored as District of the Year.





To the editor:



New Britain # 117, Christmas Donation to PIKA (Tandem), Xamogelo tou Paidiou, and Agios Konstantines Church Kitchen

At Christmas 2015, New Britain, Elpis # 117, donated \$1000.00 it had raised to three charitable organizations in Greece. Stergia Georgacopoulos, daughter of Past President Costa Georgacopoulos, lives in Greece and volunteers her time at several charitable organizations. The money was spent procuring items needed by the groups. In addition to Past President Georgacopoulos and his daughter, his wife Georgia, and two sons Nicholas and John assisted in obtaining and distributing the needed items.

PIKPA is a state institution located in Voula, Athens it hosts about 100 children that have moderate to heavy physical and/or mental disabilities. Their parents abandoned most of the children. We donated to the volunteer house Tandem. The 18 children who live there were provided clothing and personal care items.

Xamogelo tou Paidiou (The Child's Smile) main objective is to defend the rights of children. Their group home protects children from danger, and tries to reintroduce them to society. The volunteers asked for a table and chairs, along with school supplies. The volunteers and children were grateful for the items; pictures of the children cannot appear in any publication for fear of the children's safety.

Agios Konstantinos Church kitchen in Ilioupoli, Athens is run by the church's Philoptochos Society. The women take turns cooking everyday to provide food to local families in need. They requested chicken, pork, pasta, tomato sauce, olive oil, butter and milk. While unloading the food supplies at a the church, a passerby asked who made the donation of food. When told who made the donation, she said "Please thank them for all that they do. God will never forget their generosity to those in need."


