





AHEPA Receives \$1.25 Million Gift from Estate of Nancy Horton Largest one-time cash gift will support the AHEPA Hospital in Thessaloniki

AHEPA announced a gift of \$1.25 million to its Charitable Foundation, the largest one-time cash gift from a donor in the organization's 95-year history, from the Estate of Nancy P. Horton. An annual donation will be made in Nancy Horton's name in support of the AHEPA Hospital in Thessaloniki, Greece. "Words cannot express our sincere appreciation and gratitude to Nancy Horton, a tremendous philhellene who was a philanthropist and academic," Supreme President Zachariades said. "Austerity measures have taken a toll on Greece's public health sector where public hospitals' budgets have been slashed and medical supplies recycled. Nancy Horton's generosity will help to address this dire situation."

Nancy Horton, an author and poet, passed away February 18, 2016, at the age

of 103. Horton was the daughter of George Horton, who was the former United States Consul General in Athens and Smyrna at the time of the September 1922 Catastrophe. He authored the book, "The Blight of Asia," which was a first-person eyewitness account of the Smyrna Catastrophe.

"Nancy Horton's extraordinary benevolence will be memorialized at the AHEPA Hospital in Thessaloniki," said Nicholas A. Karacostas, chairman, AHEPA Board of Trustees. "It's her selfless charitable giving that will allow AHEPA to continue to meet its public health assistance to Greece; a commitment that AHEPA has maintained for seven decades, starting in the aftermath of World War Two."

Executive Director Basil Mossaidis added, "AHEPA is deeply grateful to Nancy Horton, who appreciated the importance of philanthropy and education and the positive impact AHEPA has had in the community when it comes to meeting these facets of the organization's mission. Her example of donating to our organization is inspiring."

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: January 30, 2017 Statement on Executive Order on Immigration

Andrew C. Zachariades, Supreme President of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (Order of AHEPA), the leading association for the nation's millions of American citizens of Hellenic heritage and Philhellenes, has issued the following statement: "America is a nation of immigrants. Our immigrant forebears fled war-torn nations to come to America in search of peace, security, and a better way of life in pursuit of the American Dream. AHEPA was founded by visionary Greek immigrants who were determined to find harmony among their new neighbors in America and who sought to foster American patriotism and good citizenship. "The United States must be safe and secure. However, we believe an optimal immigration policy is one that strikes a balance between national security and the rule of law. "A broad travel ban based on an ethnic or religious test is inconsistent with American values and is counterproductive to our national security. We also believe refugees who have gone through extensive screening, and who are deemed to pose no threat to our national security, should be afforded the opportunity to pursue the American Dream.

Moreover, although the Department of Homeland Security has

stated the travel ban does not include permanent legal residents, we are deeply concerned about the executive order's impact upon them and upon individuals with dual citizenship. 

### May Their Memories Live Eternal

#### **Martin Gottesdiener**



Martin Gottesdiener passed peacefully in his sleep on Jan. 8, 2017. He was surrounded by family.

Marty was born to Isadore and Lena Gottesdiener on Nov. 15, 1924, in Brooklyn, N.Y. In 1938, the family moved to New London where Marty attended the

Bulkeley School and played right guard on their powerhouse football team.

After graduation, Marty joined the U.S. Army where he served with distinction as a forward observer in the field artillery during World War II. He was discharged after the war a Staff Sgt., and earned two ribbons and two metals. He carried the pride of service for the rest of his life.

After the war, Marty attended the University of Connecticut where he studied accounting and law. In the summer of 1952, Marty met Barbara Jacobs on the boardwalk of Ocean Beach Park, and married her in the spring of 1953. She became his wife of 63 years, and together they had four beloved children. They raised their children to be kind, hard working and ethical. They will always be his pride and joy.

Newly married, a growing family, and his service and education behind him, Marty set out to make his mark in the business world. He started Martin Gottesdiener & Company, CPA's and built a reputation as an astute business advisor, turnaround specialist, and entrepreneur. He was known for his fierce loyalty to his clients and friends and their businesses. He founded two banks including the Bank of Southeastern CT. At times he ran numerous other businesses including Pilgrim Airlines, car dealerships, a resort, and travel companies. He was also a longtime faithful member of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA) for 34 years.

In his 50s, after some "gentle" prodding by his beloved wife, Marty put down his trusty pipe and cigars, and discovered the fitness craze, taking up golf, tennis, and running with passion. Periodically, Marty would slow down enough to travel the world with his wife. He loved his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchild deeply, and instilled in them his most closely-held values, education, hard work and integrity. He will be remembered for his intelligence, sharp wit, work ethic, war stories, and endearing and charismatic smile.

Marty is survived by his cherished wife, Barbara Jacobs Gottesdiener; his four children, Dr. Keith Gottesdiener, Bart Gottesdiener, Lawrence Gottesdiener, and Amy Gottesdiener; his daughters-in-law, Beth Jacobs and Robyn Belek Gottesdiener; his younger brother, Emanuel; his sisters-in-law, Shirley and Ray (wife of his older brother Nathan, who passed in 2002); six grandchildren, Laura, Andrew, Matthew, Ben, Jesse, and Asher; and one great-grandchild, Aaron Gottesdiener.
