Supreme President Hollister Issues a Statement on the Rebuilding of the Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine



WASHINGTON (December 13, 2017) -- As a donor organization to the rebuilding of Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at World Trade Center, AHEPA Supreme President Carl R. Hollister has issued the following statement:

"We are deeply disappointed that construction of St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at World Trade Center has come to a halt and regret the inadequate transparency provided thus far about the project's construction status.

"We have been in communication with His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios and members of the Archdiocesan Council to convey our concerns about Saint Nicholas. We encourage the Archdiocese to provide complete clarity to the community about the challenges the project faces

and provide a comprehensive plan to move forward so that it may be completed in a timely fashion. This is not a time to lay blame. Rather, all stakeholders must come together to complete this most noble undertaking.

"Regarding our members, we value the countless hours of volunteer time, energy, and resources that helped to bring us to the cusp of AHEPA's \$1 million capital campaign fund drive goal. In addition, the AHEPA family, which includes the Daughters of Penelope, Sons of Pericles, and Maids of Athena, each have raised funds for Saint Nicholas. We have all our volunteer members' interests at heart.

"We will continue to monitor the situation and remain in communication with the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. We will proceed with the balance of our commitment at the appropriate time when our concerns are resolved.

"We remain supportive of the rebuilding of the only House of Worship destroyed on September 11, and we remain confident it will rise again and be a beacon for peace."

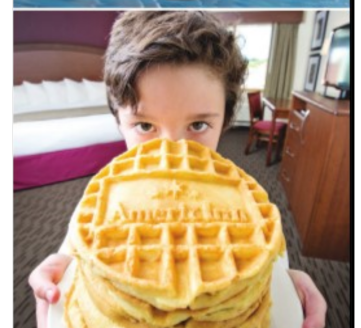

My Editor's Notes this issue are a personal tribute to two iconic Ahepans who were taken from us, just days apart, in December, 2017.

Mo Moshovos

When Mo decided to run for District 7 Governor, he asked if I would join him as Lt. Gov. Having known him for many years I quickly accepted. For the next two years we were inseparable, bonding not only as Ahepan brothers, but "true brothers". Mo had a unique way of reaching and motivating chapters. He was a lover of the language process and enjoyed creating ingenious acronyms which he used to illustrate points he wanted to make. He was a great story teller and each chapter heard his "Sam Ting" story; sometimes more than once.

His personal achievements were many: athlete, entrepreneur, husband, father, grandfather, and devoted member and leader of St. George Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Hartford. He advocated tirelessly for the AHEPA Academy Program. He understood the

unique benefits

of the Academy and recruited many students to be sponsored by the Hartford chapter of AHEPA. He was a proud Rotarian and received its highest service award, the Paul Harris lifetime service award. I was honored to be present for that milestone. During his tenure as Governor, he was declared National District Governor of the Year.

Mo was devoted to his family, the church, Rotary, and of course AHEPA. During our many trips to visitations I felt I was a part of his family as he told of the many achievements of his precious grandchildren, whether athletically, musically or academically.

My dear friend, you enriched my life and I thank you for allowing me to be a part of your AHEPA journey.

George Anagnostos

My experience with Bro. George was on a different level than that of Mo. For many years we had a professional fraternal relationship as active members of District 7. It wasn't until I began working with George on the District Scholarship committee and the NERC committee that I began to understand the depth and the quality of the man.

George had an impressive service record, both

in the military and in the AHEPA. He was an integral part of the AHEPA housing program helping the lives of countless people who could never have afforded the kind of accommodations AHEPA housing provided. However, with all his accomplishments, what impressed me the most was George Anagnostos the man. This was a man who was comfortable in his own skin. There were no pretensions around George. He had a quiet strength and could take charge of situations and make sure the conclusions were satisfactory. He was one of the kindest, most gentle, caring individuals I've ever known. Always respectful, never negative, things got done when George was in charge. He and the love of his life Ellen organized and carried out the NERC Convention in Newport for many years. They made it easy for everyone handling all of the details and constantly pushed those on "Greek Time" to be more efficient.

Bro. George led a life of accomplishment in everything he did. I'm proud to have known and served with George. His loss is a devastating one to not only his family, but also to St. Spyridon and his Newport Chapter.

New Haven Hosts Silver Anniversary Convention

New Haven has completed plans for the greatest District Convention in the history of Yankee District No. 7 that will be held on June 1, 2, and 3, 1957. All of the committees under the general chairmanship of Brother C. P. Verinis have been working feverishly completing their plans so that they might present to the delegates and visitors a week-end that will linger long in their fondest memories.

In addition to the meetings that will be held by the Ahepans and the Daughters, there will be a conclave of the Sons of Pericles for the first time in seven years. Although the Maids of Athens will not be assembled in convention, Grand Treasurer Dorothy Kledaras, of the New Haven Chapter, will be honored at the Convention Banquet.

Greek Night

"Glendi" (Greek Night) will start the gala festivities of the forthcoming Yankee District No. 7 Convention in New Haven, Connecticut, on June 1, 1957 from 8:30 p.m. to 1:30 a.m. The dance will be held in the huge West Haven Armory, 505 Main Street, West Haven, Connecticut, which has a capacity of 1,000 persons. Dancing will be enjoyed under a shining crystal balls and gaily colored

lights, giving an exotic, glittering effect. To add to the atmosphere, sixty cabaret-styled table settings will be arranged around the dance floor.

Peter Kara, known in New York for Continental Mambo rhythm and Greek-styled music, won't be the only entertaining feature . . . for with him will be Carl Hatzis, known throughout New England for his Oriental and Greek music (including a popular male vocalist).

Admission for the dance is \$4.00 per person, which includes a mezzethes plate, consisting of Greek cheese, olives, sliced meat, rolls, and wedges of celery, tomatoes, and cucumbers, which will be prepared and served by the New Haven Sons and Maids of Athens. Set-ups will be available on the premises at a nominal fee.

Co-chairmen Brother Michael Zahariades and Sister Esther Dometios assure all of us that a fabulous evening of music and dancing are to be expected.

Golf Tournament

The Yale Golf Course has been selected as the sight of the Annual Golf Tournament, to be held Sunday morning, June 2. Tee off time will be 9-11 a.m. Caddies will be available.

Co-Chairmen Brothers Jimmy Verinis and Manny Dakis will use the Calloway System of handicaps. Green fees are \$5.00 and the entrance fee has been set at \$1.50.

At press time we know of three trophies that will be awarded. There will be trophies for low gross and low net. District Governor Ted Constantinou has announced a large trophy that will take three wins for permanent possession.

AHEPA Mourns the Passing of Past Supreme President Gus J. James

Brother James, a Life Member of AHEPA Robert E. Lee Chapter 122, Norfolk, Va., with 54 years of service, passed away January 1, 2018. He was 79. Brother James served two terms as Supreme President (2005-2007). He also served in other national offices, including Supreme Counselor and as member of the Board of Trustees. He served in every elected District 3 and chapter office before becoming active on the national level on the Board of Trustees and as a Supreme Lodge officer. In 2005, James was elected Supreme President at the Supreme Convention in Boston. He served as Supreme President for two consecutive terms. As Supreme President, James embarked on a strategy to secure Greece's inclusion into the United States' Visa Waiver program, which became a reality in 2010. Under James' administration, what would become the annual AHEPA Capitol Hill Day first took form in conjunction with the 2006 AHEPA Congressional Banquet. In 2015, Brother James was presented with the AHEPA Lifetime Achievement Award at the 41st Biennial Congressional Banquet.

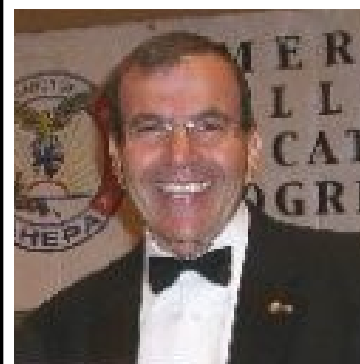


He coined the "Voice of Hellenism" campaign where AHEPA commemorated excellence in the promotion of Hellenism around the world and also highlighted the accomplishments of AHEPA with the production of the 85th Anniversary video. During his two-year administration, AHEPA awarded approximately \$200,000 for scholarships and the promotion of education. James was an advocate for Hellenic issues and travelled the country spreading the good work AHEPA achieves in the community.



James was born Kostas Yiangou Yiassemis on Cyprus in 1938. With his two sisters, he moved to the United States when he was seven years old. James graduated from William and Mary School of Law in 1966. He rose through the ranks at the law firm of Kaufman & Canoles, becoming Managing Partner, President and Chairman of the Board, before he retired. Very active in his community at the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church in Norfolk, James served as president of the council for eight different terms. As chairman of the building fund, he

oversaw the completion of a \$2 million addition to the community center. Gus served many community and civic organizations, including: Commissioner of the Norfolk Airport Authority, a member of the Board of Directors of the Towne Point Club, Sentera Advisory board, Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce, and so much more.



James is survived by his wife, the former Helen N. Alexion, and two daughters, Mary-Margaret and Nicole, a son-in-law, George Phillips, and a grandson.

"Brother James will be remembered as a strong, brilliant, and inspirational leader, who left a legacy at each level of office in which he served the Order," Supreme President Carl R. Hollister said. **"An outstanding Ahepan, and stalwart of the southeastern Virginia community, Brother James served on the boards of several public and private institutions and was a tremendous advocate for Hellenic ideals and Orthodoxy. He truly will be missed. Our deepest sympathies and condolences are with his wife, Helen, and his family. May his memory be eternal."**

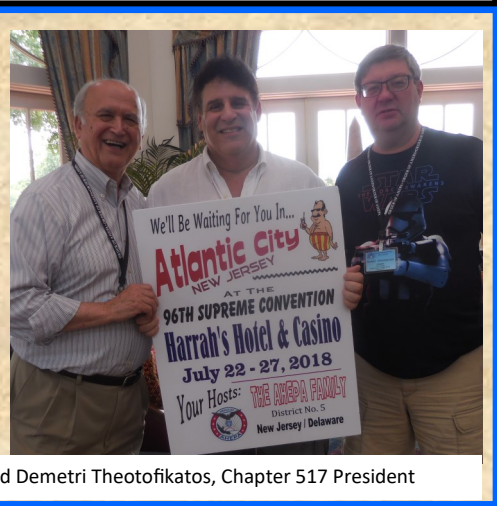

Emmanuel "Mo" Moshovos - Memory Eternal

Emmanuel "Mo" Moshovos, 83, of East Hartford, CT passed away on Wednesday, December 13, 2017. Mo was the son of the late Dimitrius and Stella Dolfas Moshovos, and was predeceased by his beloved wife Lucy (Krikorian) to whom he was married for 31 years. He is survived by his daughter, Christina Kowalczyk and her husband Michael of Northville, MI, and his son James Moshovos and his wife Amy of Upper Montclair, NJ. He also leaves his grandchildren Aaron and Jennifer Kowalczyk, and Dylan and Kaitlyn Moshovos. In addition, he leaves behind his sisters, Anne Greene of Madison and Pana Gawle of Deland, FL and many nieces, nephews and godchildren. Mo was born in Bloomfield, CT and graduated Weaver High School in 1951, where he Captained the football team, earning All-State honors. He received a full athletic scholarship to Arnold College, which later became The University of Bridgeport. He was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict era and served in an intelligence unit at McCord Airforce base in Tacoma, Washington until his honorable discharge in February 1954. Upon his discharge, Mo returned to college at The University of Hartford, graduating in 1958. He began his professional career in the Insurance field, working at Sun Life of Canada and the Hartford Insurance Group, as a District Manager. He also was involved in the restaurant business, opening the first Mr. Steak east of the Mississippi, as well as The Horseless Carriage an upscale eatery in East Hartford. He earned his real estate appraisal certification, starting his own company EDM Associates and continued in the profession, in various capacities, for the next 30 years, retiring in 2010. Mo was active in his church, St. George Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Hartford, his entire life,



beginning as an Altar Boy through his time on the Parish Council for 36 years, on the Board of Directors and as Vice President. He was a proud member of AHEPA (American Hellenic Progressive Association) and served as President of the Hartford Chapter 58 for eight terms. He then was elected AHEPA District 7 Governor for two terms and was recognized nationally as District Governor of the Year. Emmanuel joined the East Hartford Rotary Club in 1969 and was honored in 2012 with the highest service award from rotary, The Paul Harris Award.

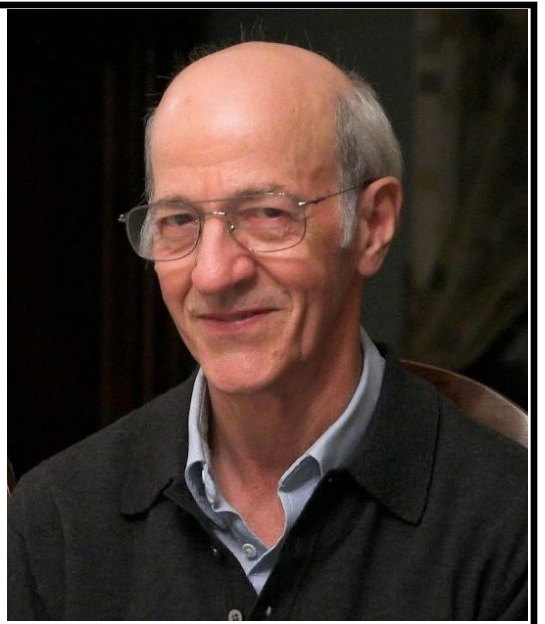

US Navy Ret. Capt. George Anagnostos - Memory Eternal

NEWPORT, RI – Captain George Anagnostos, USN, Retired, of Portsmouth, RI died on Friday, December 15, 2017 at Newport Hospital surrounded by his loving family. He was the husband of Ellen (Kasiaras) Anagnostos for 60 years. Born on June 21, 1933 in Manchester, NH, he was the son of the late Apostolos and Anastasia (Kaltsas) Anagnostos. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Tufts University in Medford, MA, where he was one of two students from New Hampshire selected for the NROTC program. Commissioned an Ensign upon graduation in 1955, Capt. Anagnostos' career included a number of assignments and responsibilities both afloat and ashore. Shore assignments included the command of two Naval Reserve Centers; Instructor of Mathematics at the U.S. Naval Academy; and tours at the Naval Command Systems Support Activity and the Bureau of Naval Personnel. He also served as the Atlantic Representative for the Chief of Naval Reserve, coordinating the annual and weekend active duty training Periods for 25,000 Naval Reservists.



Afloat assignments included duty aboard the *USS Princeton* (LPH-5), where he was in charge of deck and boat operations for the Apollo 10 capsule recovery. He also served as First Lieutenant aboard the *USS Kankakee* (AO-39); First Division Officer aboard *USS Rushmore* (LSD-14); and Executive Officer of the *USS Hunting* (EAG-398).

His decorations include the Navy Achievement Medal; Meritorious Unit Commendation; the Vietnam Service Medal with two stars; the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Meritorious Unit Citation and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Capt. Anagnostos assumed command of Naval Reserve Readiness Command Region One in Newport, RI in October 1978. He retired in 1981 after 26 years of service to his country.

Never without a commitment, he earned a second bachelor's degree in Computer Information Systems from Roger Williams College, which he put to use during many years as the Managing Editor of *The Hellenic Chronicle*, working alongside his sister, publisher Antigone Agris.

His selfless service continued in retirement, giving countless hours to the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA). He was instrumental in the AHEPA Housing Corporation's work to provide low income housing across the nation. Over the years, he held many positions in the Order of AHEPA, including District Governor of Yankee District 7; Supreme Secretary of the Order of AHEPA; and copy editor of the AHEPA Magazine.

A long-time member of the Masonic Lodge, he became a Master Mason at St. Paul's Lodge in Middletown, RI and went on to become a 32nd degree Mason and member of the Scottish Rite.



Over the last 40 years on Aquidneck Island, he served quietly in his home parish of St. Spyridon in Newport and was often spotted in the kitchen at Hellenic Fest in the summer.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his children: Paul D. Anagnostos (Dr. Brian Price) of Ft. Lauderdale, FL; Lynn A. Cullins (Chris) of Mechanicsville, MD, and David J. Anagnostos (Carrie) of Warren, RI. He also leaves a sister, Sophia Rantis of Fairfax, VA, and six grandchildren: Nicole, Christopher and Mark Cullins, and Steven, John and Jason Anagnostos. He is also survived by his two godsons, Stephen C. Giotas and Thomas G. Daskal, both of New Hampshire. He was preceded in death by his brother James Anagnostos and sister Antigone Agris.


