Theodore Modis' visit to Chapter 98 Submitted by E. Vagos Hadjimichael, PhD

On February 28, 2019, Theodore Modis, PhD, discussed his recently published book "Fortune Favors the Bold- A Woman's Odyssey through a Turbulent Century" at a meeting hosted by Chapter 98 in the Lightle Center of St. Barbara Church in Orange, CT. The "turbulent century" refers to the turbulent history of Greece during the 20th century, marked by wars and conflict for the greater part. The narrative is the very personal history of generations of the Modis family, spanning decades of life experiences which mirror the convulsions suffered by the Greek nation as a whole, from the exodus of the Greek population from Konstantinopolis and from the rest of Asia Minor in 1921, the geopolitics in the Balkan peninsula, WWII and its long-lasting aftermath, to the end of the century.

The story has a novel-like character and makes for a fascinating reading. The meeting, open to the community, was attended by about fifty people who peppered the author with questions, following his presentation. Dr. Modis was born in Florina in northern Greece. Following his high school education at Anatolia College in Thessaloniki, he was admitted to Columbia University on full scholarship, and earned his undergraduate degree in electrical engineering and his doctoral degree in Physics. Following postgraduate work at the Brookhaven National Laboratory, and a research appointment at CERN, the European Center for Nuclear Research, he transitioned to work in the social and business domains, specializing in applying scientific concepts to predicting social phenomena. He authored several books in this area, before devoting his energies to family history entwined with Greek history in the 20th century. He now lives with his family in Lugano Switzerland.

President Donald J. Trump and His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, Geron of America, provided remarks. Supreme Secretary George Horiates, Daughters of Penelope Grand President Demi Thomas, Sons of Pericles Supreme President Gregory Vourloumis, Maids of Athena Grand President Tatiana Tsaprailis, Executive Director Basil Mossaidis, and DOP Executive Director Elena Saviolakis represented the AHEPA family.

Excerpts from President Trump's remarks from the East Room of the White House before signing the Greek Independence Day Proclamation Thursday, March 22:

"This evening, we also celebrate the countless ways Greek Americans strengthen and uplift and inspire our nation. You live by the values that are the foundation of America's greatness. You

really do. You honor hard work. You love your families. You enrich your culture. And you embrace the American Dream and you keep faith in the blessings of Almighty God. And that's great."

Today, we are honored to be in the presence of Greek Americans who have served in the American Armed Forces — many, many great Greek Americans — (applause) — including Senior Airman Gregory Manuel, who is currently a reservist with the 42nd Intelligence Squadron. I love that word. Where is Gregory? Where are you, Greg? Look at him. Handsome guy. (Applause.) Handsome guy. Good. Thank you very much for being here, Gregory. And Major Carl Hollister, who served in the Army for more than 20 years. And we're very proud of Carl. Where's Carl? (Applause.) Carl? Thank you. Thank you, Carl. To Gregory and Carl, and everyone who has defended America and its uniform: We applaud your patriotism and we salute your noble service to our nation. We very much appreciate it. Thank you very much. Great job."

Greek Independence Day Celebrated at Connecticut State Capital from The National Herald, March 29, 2019

Greek Independence Day was celebrated at the Connecticut State Capital in Hartford on March 25. Connecticut State Representative Themis Klarides served as the Master of Ceremony and was joined by her sister, Nicole Klarides-Ditria, also a Connecticut State Representative, as a speaker in the program. The Klarides sisters are the first two sisters serving simultaneously as State Representatives in the history of the State Legislature.

Themis was elected in 2018 to her eleventh term, and following the statewide elections was unanimously chosen for the third time as Republican House Leader by her Republican colleagues, the first female to ever hold the position. Her sister, Nicole, was

also re-elected in 2018, and is now serving her second term. Themis and Nicole are the granddaughters of Greek immigrants, and grew up in a prominent Greek family in Seymour, CT, that ran two well-known supermarkets.

Amongst the numerous Greek-American organizations represented, Attorney Gregory J. Stamos, Past Supreme Counselor of the Order of AHEPA and President of the Hellenic Bar Association of Connecticut, represented both AHEPA and the Connecticut Greek attorneys and noted that the missions of both organizations encompassed the values so valiantly fought for by the Greeks asserting their independence from

In particular, Professor Tomazos' extraordinary leadership was extolled by Chris Skabardonis, President of the Pan-Gregorian Association, which has served as a major financial supporter of the Hellenic Studies Center at UConn for many years.

Professor Pismisis has explained that the much-needed money can be used to purchase replacement instruments, and has happily reported that the school will be able to purchase a new photocopier with the monies they have now received. The final dinner was given by Giannitsa's Mayor, Mr. Gregory Stamkos, and a group of local amateur singers and musicians performed for the students and escorts, led by Mr. K. Papadopoulos and G. Dontsios.






