A MESSAGE FROM THE AHEPA D7 GOVERNOR

EDITOR'S NOTES by Jack Isaac

Now that the Supreme Convention is over we should begin the discussion of what we can do to improve the functioning of our beloved Fraternal Organization. I think most of us would agree that the strength of AHEPA resides in its chapters. If they are successful, then the Districts, Regions, and National AHEPA will also thrive. In my experience I've noticed some things in our chapters that, in my opinion, need improvement:

1) GET THEM TO MEETINGS: While some are satisfied as long as members pay their dues, I am not. Members never make that emotional attachment to a chapter unless they are present at meetings. I've seen where non-attendees leave chapters since the all important bonding never took place. Let's use my home chapter of New Britain as an example. We decided that in order to improve attendance we needed to make some changes. The first thing we did was link scholarship eligibility to attendance. A member must attend half of the years meetings if he wants scholarship eligibility. This has worked for us, and I suspect it would work for other chapters to get members to meetings. We do other things as well. Dinner meetings are held regularly, and drawings are held of paid members. Winners get a rebate of their yearly dues. Other chapters in our District are doing similar things with much success. Some have speakers or show movies to bring in members who don't attend regularly.

2) MAKE OFFICER POSITIONS MORE ACCESSIBLE TO MEMBERS: I've attended many meetings of chapters through our Region where brothers have held officer positions for decades. While we applaud their dedication to The Order of AHEPA, it's not always good for the future of their chapter. Everyone brings their own ideas and chapter goals to officer positions. Without an opportunity to hold office, those new ideas will never see the light of day. Officers would invariably tell me that brothers don't step up to take positions so they just continue in their roles. I would tell them that brothers become satisfied if things are running smoothly and would not challenge an officer of longstanding service. If you want to facilitate change, you must step down so others can serve. Brothers will lose interest if they can't have the opportunity

to serve as an officer. I'm not proposing term limits, but at some point it will be time to give some of the younger brothers a chance. Use your experience to mentor those new officers. I think the results will surprise you.

These are just a few ideas designed to start a discussion in your chapter. Continue the great work you're doing and let's move with great hope into our next 100 years.



Salute to a Veteran ~ James C. Rouman ~

Dr. James Rouman was a hospital corpsman in the US Navy during the Second World War. Eager to serve his country at a time of unbridled patriotism following the attack on Pearl Harbor, he enlisted in the Navy at the age of 17 before finishing high school in his home town of Tomahawk, Wisconsin. Following boot camp at the Great Lakes Naval Base in Illinois, he was sent to the Hospital Corp School at Farragut Naval Base in Idaho for training as a medical corpsman. Upon graduating, he was transferred to the Bremerton Naval Hospital in the Puget Sound of Washington State for further

training as a surgical operating room technician, focusing on the care of wounded and injured servicemen requiring palliative and reconstructive surgery. Prior to his discharge from service, he was assigned to the USS New Jersey and its Marine Corp division. It is the conviction of brother

Rouman that the experiences he had in the Navy served as introductory events to a lifetime involvement in the surgical arena, and that his commitment to his country during formative years of his youth impacted his decision to become a physician. Brother Jim is a member of Nathan Hale Chapter 58.



Three Important Events and a Noticeable Absence!

This year 2022 is a year full of important dates and anniversaries. One of them brings pride to our hearts, the others bring only sorrow, sadness, and reflection.

AHEPA 100 Years Anniversary: 1922-2022

This year we are celebrating 100 years of AHEPA – a few visionary men understood that strength is in the numbers, the local community, the extended communities and not on the individuals! They started something big during uncertain and challenging times, and introduced



the concept of "Brotherhood" as a way of preserving and communicating common values. They believed that strength is in unity, responsibility, engagement, education and similar. They created a grass root campaign that at some point in time numbered tens of thousands of members.

The Burning of Smyrna by Turks: 1922-2022, Η Σμύρνη μάνα καίγεται!

100 years ago, Hellenism was erased from Asia Minor in the final act in Turkey's genocide of its Christian minorities. Having survived and thrived for 3,000 years, the Greek presence in Asia Minor was wiped out in the Great Fire of Smyrna, in 1922. Mustapha Kemal's army entered Smyrna on September 9th, 1922. By September 22nd, Smyrna was unrecognizable. The fire - lit by Turkish forces - swept through the city and burned the Greek and Armenian quarters to the ground, erasing anything that would remind future generations of their presence. After arriving in

Athens in late 1922, following the destruction of Smyrna, Ernst Otto Jacob, the General Secretary to the Smyrna Y.M.C.A declared the Turkish policy of the elimination of the Christian minorities in Asia Minor has been determinedly carried into effect. The Christian quarters of Smyrna have been practically wiped out.



The Invasion and Occupation of Cyprus by Turkey: 1974-2022

This year marks over 48 years of the illegal invasion and occupation of the Republic of Cyprus by the Republic of Turkey, a NATO-member country. This was, and remains to this day, an intolerable act; one that is a gross violation of the rule of law, human rights, and democratic ideals. We pause to remember the innocent civilians who lost their lives and those who went missing. The illegal invasion and occupation caused the displacement of 170,000 refugees who to this day are unable to return to their homes. Moreover, Turkey's restrictions upon religious freedom and destruction of Cyprus' cultural and religious heritage in Turkish-occupied Cyprus have been well-documented by the U.S. Helsinki Commission, the Law Library of Congress, the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom, and several media publications. Today, over 40,000 Turkish troops and thousands of Turkish residents implanted on the island of Cyprus from mainland Turkey occupy the Northern part of Cyprus with plans to colonize the island.

Today, Greek American organizations are engaged in a huge effort to prevent Turkey from modernizing its fleet of F16s so that it will not be used against Greece, Cyprus and neighboring countries who want to live peacefully. Thankfully, many organizations are supporting this campaign. As Ahepans, we are involved in a fair number of activities such as Christmas parties, golf tournaments, dances, cigar nights, receptions, lectures, scholarships, philanthropic and educational activities, housing etc. If all that we do is geared towards promoting Hellenism and Hellenistic Ideas, then why are we absent from this Hellenic campaign? Hellenism needs to be defended as well!






