

## A MESSAGE FROM THE AHEPA D7 GOVERNOR

Dear Brothers of Yankee District 7, Greetings.

I am writing this message in March, a month shared by winter and spring alike. By the time you read this in the May issue of the Yankee News, the period of Lent and the celebration of Easter will have come and gone, and Spring 2023 will have fully changed the colors of nature. May we all be in good

fit to enjoy the delights of the season. Summertime is on the way.

Activity in District 7 Chapters has also picked up. Several initiations of new brothers into our Fraternal Order have already taken place this year. My hope is that new initiates throughout the brotherhood are given the opportunity for a thorough orientation into the Order of AHEPA and an understanding of its nature as a cauldron of fellowship and lifelong friendships. One's personal relations with God, with others, and with oneself, are what life is all about. The quality of personal relations is reflected in the quality of one's daily life. Leadership is, of course, the source of inspiration that promotes good long-term planning and management. It further shapes the chapter's profile by conferring responsibility on individual brothers, or teams of brothers, to assist with the chapter's activities. Fortunate are those chapters which have ample human assets to select "the right person for the right job", an important prerequisite for success. Skills and attitude matter when it comes to competent execution of specific tasks. Fortunate also are all brothers who have found their niche inside the AHEPA infrastructure. Their reward will be great.

At the national level, the AHEPA leadership has been projecting robustly the name and image of AHEPA in this country and abroad. The Winter 2022 issue of Ahepan illustrates the whirlwind of activities of the Supreme President Jimmy Kokotas at the four corners of the AHEPA world in this country and abroad in France and in Athens and Crete, Greece. The year 2022 being the 100th anniversary of the founding of Ahepa added impetus to celebrations commemorating the birthing of our Order.

Brother Kokotas visited D7 in early March. On March 3, he first stopped at the Connecticut Capitol where Connecticut State Lt. Governor Susan Bysiewicz and State Representatives Nicole Karides-Ditria presented him with a proclamation that commemorates AHEPA's 100 years of service, signed by Bysiewicz and CT Governor Ned Lamont. He then was given a tour of the PAIDEIA facilities on the campus of the University of Connecticut by Ilias Tomazos, Director of PAIDEIA. He closed the day at a reception and dinner in New Haven, hosted by the District 7 Lodge. In attendance were several past District Governors, past Supreme President John Grossomanides, past Supreme Governor, District 4, Jack Isaac, and past Supreme Counselor Greg Stamos. It was an opportunity to interact with Brother Kokotas, at close quarters, regarding the affairs of AHEPA and the vision for its future.

At present, the District Lodge has been busy with the organization of the District Convention on May 6, 2023, in Newport RI. This event, always shared with the Daughters of Penelope, provides an opportunity to our members to review the state of D7, honor Ahepans who have demonstrated excellence as Hellenes and Ahepans, and strengthen the alliance among the D7 Chapters.

In closing, I would like to mention and promote again the D7 Yankee News, and the D7 website, ahepadistrict7.org, as the primary nodes in district communication lines. The benefits from consistent use of these media by D7 chapters cannot be overstated.

Sincere wishes to all for many blessings in the months ahead.

These visitations are a great way to share information with local chapters about the broader Daughters objectives and administration changes. Additionally, they provide a great opportunity to know the



**EDITOR'S NOTES** by Jack Isaac

On March 3rd, 2023, Supreme President Jimmy Kokotas made a visitation to District 7. He started his day with a visit to Paideia at the University of Connecticut, where he was given a tour of the facilities. While there, he met with Prof. Ilias Tomazos, Director of Hellenic Studies at UCONN, and engaged in discussions about the role of the complex at Storrs.

That evening D7 hosted the Supreme President at a dinner at Tre Scalini's Restaurant in New Haven

CT. In attendance were most of the leadership of the district, including PSP Dr. John Grossomanides, PSC Gregory Stamos, PSG Jack Isaac, PSS George Scarveles, D7 Governor Vagos Hadjimichael and members of his District Lodge. Several PSG's were in attendance as well as Prof. Ilias Tomazos.

In a wide-ranging discussion, the Supreme President presented the current state of the Order of AHEPA, and opened the floor for questions. All present agreed that this was a highly productive meeting where we all shared our thoughts about the future of AHEPA. We ended the evening by thanking Bro. Kokotas for coming to D7 and thanked him for his long service to our beloved Fraternal Order. He and I agreed that we would find time in his frenetic schedule to sit down for an exclusive interview for the Yankee News. That interview is included here.

## EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW with AHEPA Supreme President Jimmy Kokotas

Editor: When and why did you first become an Ahepan?

**Supreme President Kokotas:** I had been involved with the Sons of Pericles at various levels of participation for quite some time. An older friend of my family had asked many times for me to join the Order of AHEPA, but it never seemed to be the right time. It so happened that a former Greek School teacher whom I respected very



much became quite ill. I went to visit him and we discussed my joining. . I made him a promise that when he recovered I would become a member. He did, and I kept my promise to him. I was about 30 years old at the time and have been a member ever since.

## Ed: You've been on countless visitations of chapters throughout the AHEPA domain. What are some of the similar characterizations of the more successful chapters?

**SP:** I think the most successful chapters are those who engage in outreach in their communities and provide opportunities for the community to get to hear the story of AHEPA. I'm thinking of a chapter in Michigan that arranged for milk to be delivered to children in their community where lead had leached from its pipes. It was found that milk alleviated the symptoms. I can

tell you countless stories of Ahepans helping their communities in times of need. On a social level, a chapter recently hosted a cigar night which was attended by 350 people, most of which were not Ahepans. What a great opportunity to bring non-Greeks into our organization.

Successful chapters make it a point to regularly schedule fun activities to keep their members interested. You don't always have to have a formal business meeting. Have a dinner meeting once in a while, watch sports events, and bring in speakers. This will help retain your membership and will attract new members. Constant two hour formal business meetings tend to be counter-productive.

## Ed: What are some of the strengths and weaknesses of the Order of AHEPA?

**SP:** One great strength is the dedication of our members to AHEPA and its goals. Many of our members have served the Order for decades. They truly love and appreciate the vital role we play all around the world. AHEPA is respected in all corners of the world and our brand has never been stronger.

People today have so many options as to how to spend their time. Too much time, in my opinion, is spent on social media rather than participating in community services and our Church. Ahepan brothers react quickly to disasters around the world, whether man-made or natural. We are an organization with a big heart and this is without question one of our biggest strengths. We generously give of our time, treasure and talents to help our fellow man.

## Ed: How has the position of Supreme President changed Jimmy Kokotas?

**SP:** First of all I've had the great honor to represent the thousands of brothers all around the world. It has been a great opportunity to meet and confer with important world political and religious leaders from many different countries. This has been a tremendous educational experience and a once in a lifetime opportunity.

It has given me the chance to honor our ancestors who served the Order of AHEPA so faithfully. On a personal note, I wish my father could have lived to see me experience the Supreme Presidency of his beloved organization. I truly believe he is watching what is happening and feeling the pride of a father. I also wish my daughter were a little older so she could understand the enormity of my present role in AHEPA.

## Ed: Every President of the United States since Ronald Reagan has left a private note to his successor in the famous "Resolute Desk" in the Oval Office. What would Supreme President Kokotas' note say to the man who will succeed you?

**SP:** I would tell him to remember how privileged he should feel to attain the leadership of the greatest Greek-American organization in existence. I would say to always try to do what's right for AHEPA. He should make every attempt to boost people's morale and sense of esteem. He should set the tone for others by being positive and humble. Above all he should enjoy the opportunity to serve and have fun in the journey.

## Ed: When you complete your tenure as Supreme President, what things would you like to do for the Order of AHEPA?

**SP:** I haven't really had time to think about that, but one thing is to spend more time with my home chapter. I'm looking forward to that. I'd like to spend time motivating and mentoring the members of the Sons of Pericles, something I have done for many years. I'd also like to work to bring the many different Greek-American organizations together to work towards our mutual goals.

I think it would be a good thing for all past Supreme Presidents to continue to advise future leaders, whether by serving on the Board of Trustees or in any other capacity. Their knowledge and experience are invaluable.

**Ed:** Thank you Brother Supreme President for all you've done for the Order of AHEPA and for taking the time to let everyone get to know you a little better.



## How Should we Celebrate 25<sup>th</sup> of March 1821?

Yiannis Apostolakis, Hellenic Affairs Chair – District 7 March 25<sup>th</sup>, 1821 marks the rebirth of Greece, after

400+ years of brutal Ottoman occupation. Our fathers and mothers stood tall, when their faith, heritage and life was under siege. They fought without military training, without supplies and oftentimes without food so that today we, the descendants of heroes, patriots and martyrs, can celebrate. They fought the Ottomans as well as the oppressive powers of Europe at the time opposing any idea of freedom or independence. They were driven by faith, by the ideas of American and French revolution, by the desire to be free or to happily give their lives so that their children could be free. In their fight, they were joined by Philhellenes from the Unites States, France and other parts of the world.

Today we have many options to celebrate 25<sup>th</sup> of March. Poems, songs, parades, speeches – they are all good and necessary. *However, they typically end in about 1-2 hours and then what? Are the ideas of Hellenism, such as Greek culture, civilization, principles and ideals, including humanism, reason, the pursuit of knowledge, the arts, moderation and civic responsibility brought to life for just 1-2 hours and then they are forgotten?* 

Today, in 2023, in the Americas and throughout the world there is the new *Society of Friends*, AHEPA. We are united, by oath, to fight for Hellenism, to leave our tradition in this country and all the world and to have a voice, a pulse to fight for what our parents have left us. Above all, from 1922, we strive to guarantee our children the pride of Hellenism. *At the same time, we have offered so much to this country, much more than so many other organizations*.

Let's all add one more way to celebrate 25<sup>th</sup> of March – Philhellenes, Greeks, Greek Americans and Americans Let's celebrate 25<sup>th</sup> of March each and every day, for what it stands, as proud AHEPANs!

The Hellenic Airforce is considered one of the very best among NATO and Eastern Mediterranean countries. The way that the Hellenic Airforce practices is much more advanced than other NATO countries. A few weeks ago, (2) Hellenic Airforce pilots, while on a very risky training mission of flying low altitude above sea level, lost their lives in *defense of Hellenism*. As Ahepans, we will need to honor them and keep them in our hearts and prayers for their sacrifice. They were both very young and planning to get married soon. In the picture below from one of the funerals, according to the tradition of the Greek Armed forces there is always an officer ahead of the casket holding the sword of the fallen officer. The Hellenic Airforce soldier in front of the casket was the best man to be (*koubaros*!) of the fallen officer! There is a Greek song which goes like this: "The eagle always dies in the air!".

Truly, life throws us some curveballs. We cannot help but feel emotional. However, Brothers and Sisters of District 7, this may be a good point in time to realize the true meaning of "Defend Hellenism"!

This may be the time to think about Diamataris' comments in our D7 Fall Conference last year about reconnecting with Greece and Cyprus and helping as much as we can.






