A MESSAGE FROM THE AHEPA D7 GOVERNOR

Dear Brothers of Yankee District 7, Greetings.

We are at the threshold of the fall season of 2023. The passage of time is inevitable. The secret of a happy life is to enjoy it, as it marks our accomplishment of the past and calls forth our energies to plan the future. First, the recent past. Following the District Convention in Newport, RI, on May 6, 2023, and the election of District 7 Lodge members for 2023 -2024, we are looking forward to enjoying another year of AHEPA fellowship and progress. At the Convention, in addition

to reviewing the affairs of D7, we enjoyed presentations from Dr. Timothy Patitsas on the role and status of the Hellenic College Holy Cross School of Theology, and from Dr. Kathrine Schwab on her research on the original colors and appearance of the Parthenon statues. At the Convention banquet, we enjoyed the music of Yanni Pandelides, a member of the Convention host Chapter, Newport 245, and his band.

This year, AHEPA has resumed the Day on the Capitol Hill annual event, following a hiatus of three years caused by COVID-19. Members of the Supreme Lodge, District Governors, and other AHEPA members, participated in this year's visit to the Hill, June 14-15, 2023. For two days, we had the opportunity to connect with Congress members and affirm AHEPA's position as a major voice of the Hellenic Diaspora in support of Greek interests in eastern Mediterranean. NJ Senator Robert Menendez, NY congresswoman Nicole Malliotakis, and US ambassador to Greece George J. Tsunis greeted the AHEPA delegates. The Congressional group that carries the flag for Hellenic interests is the Congressional Hellenic Caucus, consisting currently of ninety-two members of the House of Representatives. Among the main objectives of our visit on the Hill was to entice additional Congressional legislators to join the

I was glad to participate in several recent District activities, as well. I joined members of the host Chapter Norwich 110 to welcome SP Jimmy Kokotas, on May 29. Following a reception and dinner, brother Kokotas presented commemorative awards to the mayor of Norwich, and to brothers Tony Petros and Nicholas Nikas. On June 13, we celebrated the initiation of five new Ahepans into the Nathan Hale Chapter 58, of Hartford, and on June 25, at the annual District College Scholarship awards banquet, we were proud to name eighteen college students as AHEPA Scholarship recipients. Special Thanks to the D7 Education Foundation for managing the investment fund that is the source of the scholarships.

And now, the future. May we continue to hear about your activities over this year, either in person at meetings, or on the pages of Yankee News, or the D7 website at ahepadistrict7.org. For updating your Chapter's presence on the D7 website, please forward to me updated materials. Also, the importance of each Chapter sponsoring a team of young HS age students to participate in the Hellenic History Tournament (HHT) cannot be exaggerated. This year the HHT will take place on November 18 at its regular venue, the Saint Barbara Church, Orange, CT. Details and forms relevant to participation in the HHT are posted and can be downloaded from the D7 website. Finally, two long-range projects that D7 is embarking on, this year.

(a) The Archives of D7. There is a need to establish archival material for our District. Materials from all Chapters in D7, with district-wide relevance, will be collected and curated in one of the Housing facilities of New London Chapter 250. The point persons to lead the effort will be the Warden for District 7, brother Alexandros Philippides from the Newport Chapter 245, teaming with brother Demetrius Tasoulas, PDG, from Chapter 250, vice-president of the Chapter's Housing Foundation, The idea for establishing an archival process for D7 has been discussed in the past. The time has finally come to undertake now the concrete steps that the project's fulfillment requires, and so set the stage for the future.


(b) Chapter Intervention. An appointed position of a Lodge roving ambassador to troubleshoot prevailing adverse conditions in Chapters with selfdiagnosed chronic problems has been established. At the invitation of those Chapters, the dedicated troubleshooter will visit and confer with the membership of each, under the auspices of the District Lodge, identify outstanding issues, and report suggested intervention procedures. We are glad to announce that Brother John Ververis past secretary of Chapter 110 has agreed to lead the Chapter Intervention project.

AHEPA Opens Emergency Fund for Greece's Wildfires Relief

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Supreme President Savas Tsivicos authorized the opening of the AHEPA Emergency Relief Fund on July 28, 2023, to provide humanitarian assistance for the victims of Greece's wildfires.

As in the past, AHEPA members have mobilized in response to this call to action. As the wildfires continue to burn, we have seen our chapters and members come together to help in any way possible, and are proud.

In 2007, AHEPA donated \$250,000 worth of goods and an additional \$250,000 in financial assistance to victims of Greece's wildfires. Following Greece's wildfires of 2018, AHEPA raised 159,000€ to complete a burn unit at Evangelismos Hospital in Athens.

"The images and stories coming from Greece are horrifying and tragic," Supreme President Tsivicos said. "Our thoughts and prayers are with all who have been affected by this tragedy. We are extremely grateful to Greece's first responders and to all nations that have offered support and assistance. We will stand with Greece as we did in the past and during other

times of great need." He added, "We appreciate the United States' response and commend the initiative of the Congressional Hellenic Caucus's leadership to engage USAID for assistance, which we strongly support." Anthony Guy (Tony) Calibey, born July 17, 1930 in Hazleton, PA, joined his beloved wife Alexandra (Sandy) in the hereafter on July 31, 2023. Tony, the oldest child of Anthony Frank Calibey and Catherine Fazio Calibey, was predeceased by his sister Louise Craig and brother Guy Calibey.

Tony served in the U.S. Navy from 1948 to 1953 rising to the rank of Chief Petty Officer and flying off aircraft carriers as an electronics specialist across the Atlantic and Mediterranean during the Korean

War. He met Sandy when stationed at Quonset Point, RI where they began their marriage of 60 years. Tony put himself through college with the GI Bill and was valedictorian of his class at Roger Williams. He spent his career in business machine sales beginning with Friden Business Machines and culminating with TRW. Throughout his career, which took him across the country, he excelled and won multiple company awards and accolades. He was always generous with his time and business acumen assisting others in starting successful business endeavors.

A wonderful husband, father, uncle, grandfather, colleague, role model, provider, mentor and friend, Tony was generous, helpful, loyal, personable and kind. He quietly, modestly, left a large wake. He will be missed by the many whose lives he touched.

Tony was an active member of St. George Greek Orthodox Church and a member of the Nathan Hale Chapter of AHEPA for over 30 years. He leaves his daughter Kathy and her husband Henry Salton, his son Dave and his wife Sue, his son Doug and his wife Melody, his son Greg and his wife Jill, his grandson Dan, his grandson Nick and his wife Catherine, his grandson Josh, his granddaughter Sarah Salton and her husband Carter Eckley, his grandson Skyler and his fiancée Joanne Norris, and his great-grandchildren.

Fr. Charles J. Simones, retired priest of St. Sophia Church in New London, passed away April 11, 2023. He was 91. Fr. Simones was born Jan. 30, 1932, in Lewiston, Maine, the son of the late Demetrios and Alice Lambrew Simones. He was a 1951 graduate of Edward Little High School in Auburn, Maine. He graduated from Holy Cross Seminary in Brookline, Massachusetts, in 1958, with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He received a master's in education from Trinity College in Hartford in 1972. Fr. Simones



married the former Joan Canacaris of Bath, Maine, in Portland, Maine on Sept. 28, 1958. They enjoyed 64 years of marriage together. Fr. Simones served two parishes: Annunciation Church in Quebec City, P.Q, Canada for three years and St. Sophia Hellenic Orthodox Church in New London for 45 years. The family has resided in Waterford for the last 55 years. Fr. Simones was honored with the title Sakellarios in 1967, in Lewiston, Maine, and was named a Protopresvyteros by the Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras in 1983. Fr. Simones translated three books on the Elder Porphyrios. 'Elder Porphyrios, Testimonies and Experiences', 'The Divine Flame Elder Porphyrios Lit in My Heart' and 'Miraculous Occurrences and Counsels of the Elder Porphyrios'. Fr. Simones retired from his post at St. Sophia Church in 2006. He was honored Oct. 8, 2006, by parishioners and friends for his 45 years of dedication to the parish at St. Sophia and 48 years in the Greek Orthodox priesthood. He served the Three Hierarchs Chapel on the University of Connecticut campus at Storrs, for several years after his retirement. He is survived by his wife Joan; his son Gregory Simones; his son Thomas Simones and his wife Genesis; his grandsons, George Simones and Dimitri Simones; and his former daughter-inlaw Katina Simones. He was predeceased by his grandson Constantine Simones.





Salute to a Veteran ~ George Mitchell ~

George Peter Mitchell, a 63year member of Winthrop Chapter 250 was a 1958 graduate of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. He served a year on board a Coast Guard cutter based in San Francisco before being transferred to the U.S. Naval Training Command in Pensacola Florida where he was trained as a Navy/Coast Guard aviator. His first duty station was at CG Air Station, Oahu, Hawaii flying throughout the



Pacific. In 1963 he was transferred to the C.G. air station in Brooklyn, NY. The Coast Guard again sent Mitchell to Pensacola for helicopter training. Upon returning to Brooklyn, he became involved in many searches and rescues at sea including the 1964 crash of Eastern Airlines flight 663 with 84 people on board, TWA flight 800 with 230 people on board and the collision of the tanker Stolt Dagali and the cruise ship Shalom in fog in lower NY harbor. He was twice awarded the Coast Guard Commendation Medal for helicopter rescues at sea. He retired from the Coast Guard as Lt. Commander in 1966 and went to work for PanAm where he last flew Boeing 747s to destinations all over the world.


Mitchell met and married his wife Emily while stationed in NY. They had two children, Cristina, a doctor in Providence and Peter, an attorney in NY. He is a past president of Chapter 250 and was its treasurer for over twenty years. A life-long member of New London's Saint

Sophia, he served the church in many ways including festival chairman for years and recent chairman of its 75th anniversary celebration.

On the Pontian Genocide Remembrance Day, May 19th, we commemorate the events of 1914-1923. It's estimated that during this period 2.75 million Armenians, Assyrians and Greeks were killed. We salute the recognition of the Armenian Genocide by the United States, and we hope that this historical event will motivate us, the Greeks of America, Greek Americans, and Philhellenes to intensify our efforts to recognize the Pontian Genocide in this country and everywhere else!

Every citizen of this world needs to learn about the Pontian, Armenian and Assyrian Genocide. The lessons have not been learned and this is something we all have a responsibility to do our part to learn and teach. Let's start with our families first! We have seen over and over that if we don't learn from history and its lessons, history will repeat itself. Let's pray that this does not happen. May the memories of all those who perished in this dark period in history be eternal. May we find the courage, like the Armenians, to make the Pontian genocide recognized in this country! More important, let us pray that remembrance days like the Pontian Genocide, the fall of Constantinople on May 29, 1453, and others, make us think and re-evaluate our priorities as AHEPA Brothers and Sisters. How come the Armenian Americans fought so hard, for so many years, to recognize the Armenian genocide in this country? They never gave up, they never stopped until they were successful! Where are the Greek Americans, the Philhellenes? Where is AHEPA in all of this? I still remember the words of my father, a retired Hellenic Armed Forces officer who used to say to me: "Everything can be taken away from you, the clothes, the money, the house. Your faith, your

history, and your heritage nobody can take it away, unless you give it up vourself!"

A few statistics:

- Average time for Hellenic Affairs in every D7 convention or Conference: about 5 minutes!
- Dinner and banquet: about 3+ hours!
- Arguing about paying a few dollars more in National, per Capita, or so: hours and hours!

My grandmother's words came to mind. She worked on the farms and raised 3 children. She never got the opportunity

to educate herself in school, due to WWII, Nazi occupation of Greece and then civil war. She was born in a village outside of Korinthos, in the Peloponnese!

Nick Koukouves and Chris Nasiakos.






