

Message from the Order of AHEPA District Governor

Dear Brothers,

Yankee District #7 put in an impressive 2009 membership performance, ending the year with 765 members, the highest level in at least the last 12 years and an increase of 88 members (+13.0%) since 2008. We were the third fastest growing district after District #5 (NJ, DE) at 18.8% and District #6 (NY) at 15.4%. And in terms of growth consistency, District #7 was the only district in the country to grow more than 20% since 2007. (Only District to grow in the entire US in 2008)

We ended the year with only 13 2009 delinquent members. Among District #7 chapters, only Providence (8) and Norwalk (2) were left with more than 1. As a result, our year end membership divided by {our year end membership + remaining 2009 delinquents}, a measure of retention of existing members defined by Supreme Vice President John Grossomanides, was an impressive 98.3%, the highest of all US districts. D7 will win a \$500 prize for this achievement.

Most D7 chapters grew yearto-year. New London, Stamford and Hartford led the rest with growth greater than or equal to 33%. Our largest chapter, Norwich, managed to grow by 17% to 101 members, which will give them 4 delegates at the next national convention in Montreal. In addition, Hartford and New Haven increased their convention delegates from 2 to 3 this year. This is important because we need to show up in Montreal with as many delegates as possible to help our favorite son, John Grossomanides, become Supreme President.

On the minus side, Providence, Meriden and Danielson missed the minimum Governor's challenge and declined year-to-year. I hope that the success of the other chapters will motivate them to do better during 2010, before it becomes too late at the end of the year.

To those of you who worked hard to grow your chapter membership in 2009, I offer my congratulations and heartfelt thanks. Let's all start working for a successful year in 2010. We need to continue to work on promoting Hellenism through education, philanthropy and civic responsibility. We need to strive to increase our membership for the benefit of our community. And we need to find ways to convince all five of our Connecticut US Representatives to join the Hellenic Caucus.

In a special meeting of chapter representatives hosted by our New Haven chapter Brothers on January 30, the District decided to proceed with a second Hellenic History Tournament in 2010. I sincerely hope that every single one of our 14 chapters will sponsor at least one team this year. Please see the relevant article in this issue for more information.

Please don't forget to invite me to your chapter meetings and help keep the Yankee News relevant by continually sending your chapter news to Brother John Grossomanides.

Nathan Hale #58 opens New Senior Citizens Housing Phase II







Hellenic Cultural Corner

Spring 2010



Asclepius was the god of medicine and healing in ancient Greek mythology, according to which he was born a

mortal but was given immortality as the constellation Ophiuchus after his death. His name means "cut up," and shares a root with the word scalpel. He represents the healing aspect of the medical arts, while his daughters Hygieia, Meditrine, and Panacea symbolize the forces of cleanliness, medicine and healing (literally, "allhealing"), respectively. Occasionally he is also linked to his son Telesforos, who represents the powers of recuperation.

Asclepius' powers were not appreciated by all, and his ability to revive the dead soon drew the ire of Zeus, who struck him down with a thunderbolt. According to some, Zeus was angered, specifically, by Asclepius' acceptance of money in exchange for resurrection. Others say that Zeus killed Asclepius after he agreed to resurrect Hippolytus at the behest of Athena. In this version, Zeus smote both men with one bolt. Either way, Asclepius' death at the hands of Zeus illustrates man's inability to challenge the natural order that separates mortal men from the gods.

In honor of Asclepius, snakes were often used in healing rituals. Non-poisonous snakes were left to crawl on the floor in dormitories where the sick and injured slept. Starting about 300 BCE, the cult of Asclepius grew very popular. His healing temples were called asclepieion; pilgrims flocked to them to be healed. They slept overnight and reported their dreams to a priest the following day. He prescribed a cure, often a visit to the baths or a gymnasium. Hippocrates, the legendary doctor, may have begun his career at an asclepieion on the island of Cos.

WHAT

- A \$3,000 prize for the winning team = \$1,000 per team member, and

in the spring of 2010 are eligible to participate, even though they will be college freshmen on the date of the competition (Fall 2010).

• There is no commitment to limit the questions and answers only to items discussed in the Hellenika book. There is, however, an intention to base many of the questions on that book

Key points

- You should not feel intimidated. Hellenic history is not taught in US schools in any kind of detail, so most if not all your competitors will probably start at the same level of knowledge (or lack of it). The difference will be made by the amount of preparation each team does during the summer
- This is not a test, it's a contest. Your team wins if you have one point more than the competition
- This is a team competition, so you can maximize the chances that your TEAM will win by assigning each of the three question categories (Ancient, Roman/Byzantine, Modern) to a different team member

Differences from 2009

- Eighth graders in the spring of 2010 are now eligible to participate (in 2009: started with 9th graders)
- The prizes are \$3000 and \$1500 for the top two teams
